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


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HONOLULU DISTRICT REGULATORY BOUNDARIES

Jurisdiction extends to 3 nautical miles (or the outer continental shelf)



REGULATORY MISSION

To protect the Nation's aquatic resources and navigation capacity, while allowing reasonable development through fair, flexible and balanced permit decisions.







CORPS AUTHORITIES

Section 10 Rivers and Harbors Act (1899)

- Permits required for all work in, over or under navigable waterway, tributaries of navigable waterways, or interstate lakes or rivers.
- Focus is on maintaining navigability.

Section 404 Clean Water Act (1972)

- Permits required for discharging dredged or fill material into waters of the United States, including wetlands.
- Focus is on protecting aquatic resources; Restoring and maintaining the chemical, physical and biological integrity of the waters of the U.S.





COMMON SECTION 10 ACTIVITIES







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WHEN DO YOU NEED A PERMIT?

In **TIDAL** <u>&</u> **FRESH** waters (Tidal + streams, channels, drainage ditches, wetlands, etc.)

DISCHARGE OF FILL MATERIAL

- temporary AND permanent
- Examples: sandbag berm for stream diversion, mechanized pushing of sediment in unlined stream, construction of in-water access/staging, mechanized veg removal that disturbs roots
- (Section 404, Clean Water Act)







COMMON ACTIVITIES REGULATED UNDER SECTION 404 CWA

Bank Stabilization Boat Ramps Fish pond repair Residential Development **Beach Nourishment Seawall Construction**







MAINTENANCE OF PROJECTS

- Exemption: Maintenance, including emergency reconstruction (within a reasonable amount of time) of recently damaged parts, of currently serviceable structures such as dikes, dams, levees, groins, riprap, breakwaters, causeways, bridge abutments or approaches, and transportation structures
 - No Permit Required under Section 404*
 - ➢ IF: no change to character, scope or size of original fill design
 - ≻ Examples:
 - ➢ Debris/sediment removal using a bulldozer that pushes sediment around flood control channel to remove → No Permit Required
 - ➢ Replacing dislodged stones from bank stabilization to restore to previous design → No Permit Required
 - *However, PERMIT REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 10 IF MAINTENANCE WORK IS IN TIDAL WATERS

General Permits

- Nationwide Permits
- Regional General Permits
- Corps processing time is 60 days

Standard Permits

- Individual Permits
- Letters of Permission
- Corps processing time is 120 days
